OPEN TO THE PUBLIC

The Perth Artifactory is proud to be open to the general public for events and workshops, for groups, and casual hackers and makers. Providing and maintaining tools, workspace, machines, equipment that few people would otherwise have access to.

We are dedicated to providing a place where people of all backgrounds with an interest in technology or the arts can come together to work on projects, share ideas, and socialise.

SPONSORED STUDENT MEMBERSHIP PROGRAM

This program is now 18 months old and has supported 16 tertiary students that otherwise wouldn't be able to access the space. From engineering to metal sculpting the support of our student sponsors has allowed us to truly diversify the space.

The Sponsored Membership Program provides

- 3 months of membership and free/discounted entry to workshops and events at the Artifactory.
- Support and training on the usage of Artifactory equipment and resources
- One on one mentoring with experienced Artifactory members

RESIDENT NOIZE ARTIST PROGRAM

The Artifactory is now in it's 9th year providing a rotating artist residency, where the artist in residence gets free access to the workshop as an associate member and with an opportunity to perform at several monthly experimental music nights NoizeMaschin!!

Over a three to six month period the successful applicant receives:

- 24 hour access to the Artifactory.
- Support and training on the usage of Artifactory equipment and resources.
- Free entry to Artifactory workshops and events.
- 3 performance slots of 10 minutes at NoizeMaschin!! Perth.
- Access to the Artifactory Rehearsal Room.

The residency program is designed to assist with the creative development of original DIY projects, and foster composer, musical and artist engagement. The consecutive performance opportunities help artists to develop their craft in a supportive environment.

We are frequently sent emails and messages about people wanting to visit the Artifactory and these set open days have been beneficial to us receiving new members who can make use of our facilities.



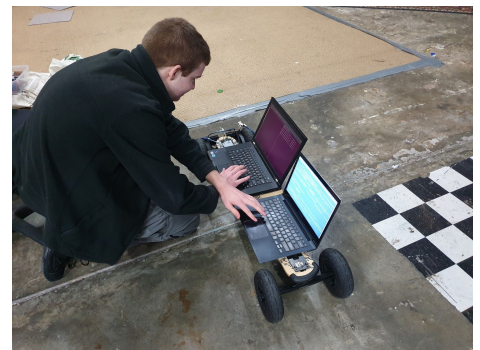
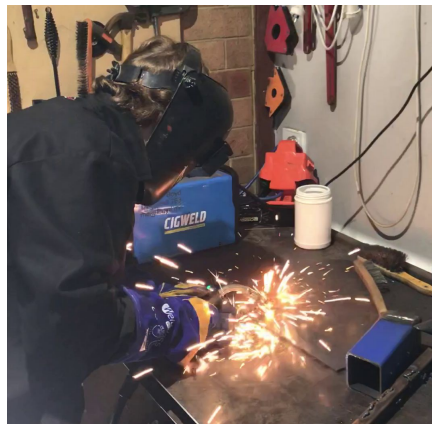
GENERAL HACKING DAY

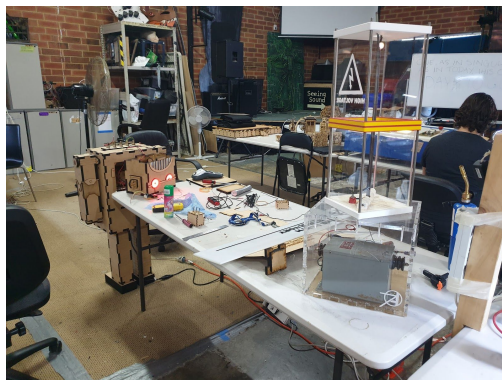
WORKSHOP WEDNESDAYS

A lot has been improved at the Artifactory this year by our dedicated volunteers. Assisted by fundraised donations and loaned/donated tooling the workshop has attained new heights in functionality and aesthetics.

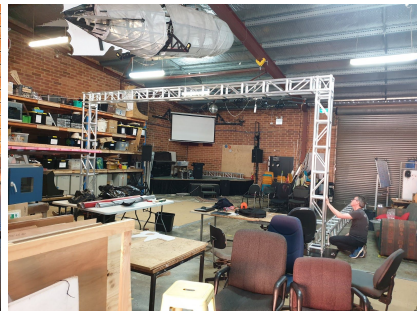
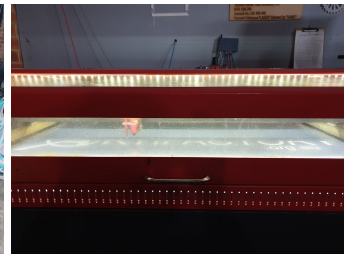
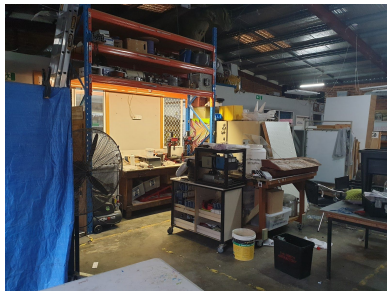
Fundraised, Loaned and Purchased items/tooling include;

- A spindle sander - *used to finish hard to reach areas requiring sanding*
- Sand blasting cabinet - to remove paint and rust
- Plasma cutter - for cutting thick steel
- 3 Ryobi One+ Impact Drivers - for correct driving of fixings
- A dramatic overhaul of our Ryobi One+ power tools
- Wood lathe
- A second metal lathe
- An Arc Welder (that doesn't suck)
- 3 resin 3D printers and 2 FDM printers
- A water cooler in the kitchen.
- Audio equipment to support our bands and performing artists

Improvements that have been made to the space from the extraordinary effort put in by our hard working members include;

- Commissioning of Middle Red! 2 laser cutters up and operational again. A 3rd laser commissioning coming this year!
- The start of the Design Room upgrades, continuing into the coming year

- A new Spray booth, dwarfing the original
- Improvements to the stage. Carpet lining the walls as sound deadening and stage performance equipment mounted under stage.
- Upgrades to the Foyer/Lobby. New display shelves for members to show off projects, upgraded BitLit with screen welcomes new members to the space.
- A new Upcycle bench decluttering the roller entry
- New benches in the project area and hot works bay

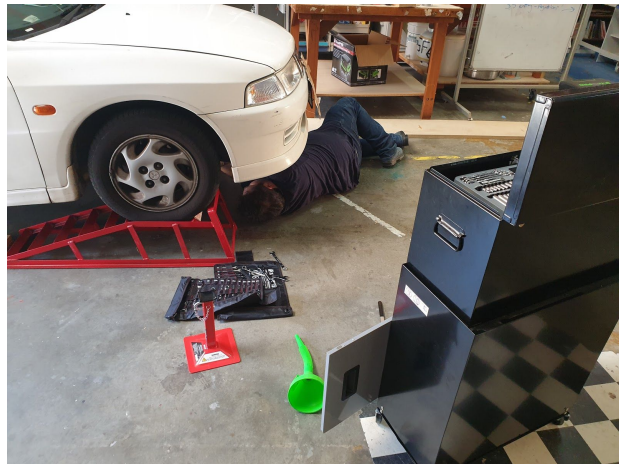
Forging and Casting

We acquired an anvil, a forge was made and we visited BAWA to learn more about the basics involved with forging. We made some leaves. Further experimentation was made in recycling lead-acid batteries into pewter and casting this pewter into silicone moulds. We've located a few reliable sources of aluminium for casting, and have gathered materials for the kiln, an important tool for accurate casting.



Automotive

Largely driven by some members wanting to fix the paint on their car, purchases have been made that have resulted in the Artifactory possessing quite a few tools for car maintenance and part fabrication. The automotive SIG is the one to talk to to make your car look really nice.



Chairperson's Report

2019-2020 has been a stressful year for us all, but I feel as if the current membership really embodies what makes the Perth Artfactory special to us all. The impression I get is that everyone views this as the shared project that it has turned out to be, with each member leaving their own mark on the space's inventory and function. We've eaked our way through the pandemic thanks to the generosity of everyone involved, and we've come out on top.

Our space has never been this well equipped, we're refurbishing rooms and fixing tools that have lain broken for years. Members have taken it upon themselves to start projects that benefit not only themselves, but the space at large, and I remain continuously impressed with the initiative and camaraderie shown by everyone.

Though we have missed a large number of events (eg. supanova) that would have given us the supplementary attention and income that would have given us a larger warchest, the implementation of group buys has largely filled in the gap.

Looking forward, if we can continue this rate of growth, acquisition and maintenance of tools, members and their skills, then we can and will become a major force in Australian makerspaces. Well done everyone, and thanks for the 2019-2020 year!

FINANCIAL REPORT

Treasurer's Commentary

This financial year has seen the financial stability of our organisation tested to its absolute limits. In the 2018-2019 financial year income from events and casual use of the space made up more than 40% of our annual income. Due to the global pandemic we lost that income overnight. However, the goal of the association has never been to nickel and dime our members. To this end the committee gave members the option of suspending their membership with no penalty for the duration of the WA lockdown. During this time we also redoubled our community outreach efforts to maintain our existing mental health initiatives.

Late 2019 also saw the addition of a project pledge system where members were able to directly donate to projects within the space. Even with my decision to suspend the program for multiple months while COVID-19 was a significant financial burden for our members we have still raised \$2100 so far.

One of our long term goals for the association has been to achieve the holy grail of charity categorisations; deductible gift recipient status. While we're not ready for another application yet I am confident that incoming changes to our residency and sponsorship programs will get us there within a few years.
