

WOMEN'S WOODWORKING

Wednesday mornings at the Artifactory are dedicated to gathering women to work on woodworking projects, learn new skills, be trained in the use of tools and machinery, and share ideas.

The group welcomes people with various levels of experience, including some using power tools for the very first time.

The focus on coming together to support each other to create things in a safe way and share our experiences. This event is perfect for gaining familiarity with tools, and building the confidence to complete woodworking projects independently.






METAL MONDAY

LASER MAINTENANCE MEETUP

Our laser cutters are maintained by a dedicated group who meets regularly to attend to their needs! Experienced laser maintainers teach new hands how to clean, adjust, and recover from the inevitable mistakes that happen while using the lasers.



BOARD GAMES

These monthly events are a low-key, social event for Artifactorians to take a break from the workshop and enjoy a board game or two on a Saturday afternoon.

NTS & WORKSHOPS





DIY SYNTH WORKSHOPS

Hosted by WAMod: West Australian Modular Synthesizers and often known simply as "ModSynth", this workshop is one of the Artifactory's most popular workshops. Enthusiasts of analogue "eurorack" style synthesisers meet up and build modules. These modules are wired together in a rack and a cacophony of sounds ensue!

LEATHER CRAFT WORKSHOP

This workshop provides lessons in traditional and modern leathercrafting by Western Leathercraft. Attendees are taught to make their own leather accessories like wristbands using common leathercrafting tools. The classes provide the skills necessary to successfully manufacture your own creations!





CURTIN ROBOTICS

The Artifactory and the Curtin Robotics club teamed up to run a soldering workshop at Curtin University.

Students new to electronics were grouped up with experienced volunteers, who guided them through the process of soldering and assembling a simple circuit board.

Participants gained soldering skills, and confidence to undertake projects that require soldering.









BUNNINGS COMMUNITY DAYS

The Artifactory was invited this financial year to participate in various community days run by Bunnings. Members pitched in to create items that represented the Artifactory's capabilities and creativeness of our community. These events also allowed for us to promote the Artifactory outside of our regularly scheduled Open Days.





PRUSA USER GROUP MEETUP

The Artifactory was honored to host the WA Prusa User Group Meetup hosted by Josef Prusa. This event saw Prusa enthusiasts from Western Australia gather at the Artifactory to learn from Josef Prusa and his team, while also getting to network with like minded individuals.







PERTH SUPANOVA

The Artifactory returned to exhibit at Perth Supanova, where we were able to show off all the things you can do in a makerspace! We talked to hundreds of people who were keen to learn about the Artifactory.

The impact of this event is a testament to the work of our wonderful members in making projects to demonstrate the various ways to engage with the Artifactory, producing items to sell, and giving their time during the event itself to spread the word of the Artifactory.





ENHANCEMENTS TO THE ARTIFACTORY

Another year of significant improvements to the tools and equipment available for use at The Perth Artifactory! We thank the generous member contributions of time and money that made all these improvements possible.

The Artifactory ethos has always included a strong community spirit of sharing and helping. Our members are always coming together to teach each other new skills as they work to improve the Artifactory's equipment and facilities.

This year's improvements, made possible by our members' generous contributions of time, materials, and know-how, include –

- Many new tools, big and small
- Big changes to the stage area and Z-lab
- New safety equipment to control airborne dust and welding flash
- New training and induction system
- Full redesign of our website and print advertising materials

EQUIPMENT AND INFRASTRUCTURE FUND

A generous donor wanted to start a fund to pay for improvements to the space, particularly with a focus on making the space more comfortable to members, and more attractive to a wider range of potential new members.

Our campaign raised \$4,800 from members, which the initial donor doubled to \$9,600!

The fund is dedicated to maintaining and improving our equipment and infrastructure.

We spent \$1,500 from the fund in FY23-24, including -

- Refurbishing the electronics and 3D printing lab
- Welding screens
- · Metal detector for woodworking
- · Air filter for the machine room
- Curtains to make the space look nice during events

Future planned projects include -

- Shade sails to cool down the courtyard during hot weather
- A new and improved machine room with better layout and dust extraction



EQUIPMENT TRAINING

In the latter half of the year, we implemented a new, tailored training system, designed to enhance tool proficiency and confidence amongst our members. Emphasizing micro-inductions, the system focuses on providing attendees with specific knowledge, training only on the tools they express a desire to use. The system has also reduced unnecessary volunteer workload and attendee information overload.



3D **PRINTING**

It's the Year of 3D Printing at the Artifactory, with our FDM printer line-up growing by leaps and bounds. First our members pitched in to buy a Bambu Labs P1S, and then Prusa gifted us a Prusa MK4 and a Prusa XL-5T. The new printers are fast, user-friendly, and multi-material capable – huge improvements on our previous printers! Our filament stock has also expanded to include dozens of different colours and materials, so our members can explore a wide range of creative options.

With more printers comes more maintenance, so we've established a new 3D Printers Subcommittee to take care of the printers. They're doing a great job of keeping the printers running and teaching people how to use them. Thanks to the inaugural subcommittee members – Fletcher, Sophie, Tom, Penny, and Ross, for making 3D Printing fun and accessible at the Artifactory!




BIG RED LASER CUTTER UPGRADES

Our Big Red laser cutter got a full controller replacement, letting us upgrade to the industry-standard Lightburn software. Lightburn is much easier to use and has many more features than our previous software – a big improvement.

EXIT STAGE LEFT

With live music events having outgrown our venue, the stage was seeing little use. We farewelled the stage and carefully dismantled it, freeing up the space for other uses. The reclaimed wood has already become part of new furniture for the space — so the spirit of the stage lives on.







TREASURER'S REPORT

We started the financial year in a very tight position, while membership numbers were showing close to historical norms, costs have been going up substantially while we have made every effort to keep membership fees the same.

This meant that there was no money for any improvements to the space, or extra costs.

Finally getting approved for our Deductible Gift Recipient status allowed us to turn a corner in many ways. With donations now being tax deductible, we were able to fund a number of great new tools through member donations, increasing the value and appeal of our memberships.

It also allowed us to launch our
Infrastructure Fund which has already shown
benefits in repairing and setting up our new

3D Print and Electronics lab, installing air filtration in the machine room, as well as other general improvements.

Thank you to everyone who donated to our campaigns throughout the year, in particular, we received two separate \$10,000 donations.

These improvements have already had a flow on effect to membership numbers, which puts us in a positive and sustainable situation going forward. Another big thanks to everyone who has put time in to our promotional events, our monthly tours, or has supported our recruiting efforts in other ways, such as tool training and general support.
